RESOLUTION 2025-40 [FY 2025 APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION]

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE KOA BAY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025 ("FY 2025"), the District Manager prepared and submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Koa Bay Community Development District ("District") a proposed budget ("Proposed Budget") along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local general-purpose government(s) having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing on the Proposed Budget and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website in accordance with Chapter 189, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, Section 190.008(2)(a), Florida Statutes, requires that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE KOA BAY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

a. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Section 190.008(2)(a), *Florida Statutes* ("**Adopted Budget**"), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.

- b. The Adopted Budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office and identified as "The Budget for the Koa Bay Community Development District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2025."
- c. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website in accordance with Chapter 189, *Florida Statutes* and shall remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, for FY 2025, the sum(s) set forth in **Exhibit A** to be raised by the levy of assessments and/or otherwise, which sum is deemed by the Board to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, to be divided and appropriated as set forth in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within FY 2025 or within 60 days following the end of the FY 2025 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

- a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.
- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.
- c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law. The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under this paragraph c. are posted on the District's website in accordance with Chapter 189, Florida Statutes, and remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

- **SECTION 1. DUE DATE.** Sealed proposals must be received no later than **August 15, 2025 at 12:00 p.m.**, at the offices of District Manager, 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W, Boca Raton, Florida 33431, (561) 571-0010. Proposals will be publicly opened at that time.
- **SECTION 2. FAMILIARITY WITH THE LAW.** By submitting a proposal, the Proposer is assumed to be familiar with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that in any manner affect the work. Ignorance on the part of the Proposer will in no way relieve it from responsibility to perform the work covered by the proposal in compliance with all such laws, ordinances and regulations.
- **SECTION 3. QUALIFICATIONS OF PROPOSER.** The contract, if awarded, will only be awarded to a responsible Proposer who is qualified by experience and licensing to do the work specified herein. The Proposer shall submit with its proposal satisfactory evidence of experience in similar work and show that it is fully prepared to complete the work to the satisfaction of the District.
- **SECTION 4. SUBMISSION OF ONLY ONE PROPOSAL.** Proposers shall be disqualified and their proposals rejected if the District has reason to believe that collusion may exist among the Proposers, the Proposer has defaulted on any previous contract or is in arrears on any previous or existing contract, or for failure to demonstrate proper licensure and business organization.
- **SECTION 5. SUBMISSION OF PROPOSAL.** Submit one (1) electronic and one (1) unbound copy of the Proposal Documents, and other requested attachments at the time and place indicated herein, which shall be enclosed in an opaque sealed envelope, marked with the title "Auditing Services Koa Bay Community Development District" on the face of it. **Pricing for each additional bond issuance is required.**
- **SECTION 6. MODIFICATION AND WITHDRAWAL.** Proposals may be modified or withdrawn by an appropriate document duly executed and delivered to the place where proposals are to be submitted at any time prior to the time and date the proposals are due. No proposal may be withdrawn after opening for a period of ninety (90) days.

- **SECTION 7. PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS.** The proposal documents shall consist of the notice announcing the request for proposals, these instructions, the Evaluation Criteria Sheet, and a proposal with all required documentation pursuant to Section 12 of these instructions (the "Proposal Documents").
- **SECTION 8. PROPOSAL.** In making its proposal, each Proposer represents that it has read and understands the Proposal Documents and that the proposal is made in accordance therewith.
- **SECTION 9. BASIS OF AWARD/RIGHT TO REJECT.** The District reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, make modifications to the work, and waive any informalities or irregularities in proposals as it is deemed in the best interests of the District.
- **SECTION 10. CONTRACT AWARD.** Within fourteen (14) days of receipt of the Notice of Award from the District, the Proposer shall enter into and execute a Contract (engagement letter) with the District.
- **SECTION 11. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY.** Nothing herein shall be construed as or constitute a waiver of the District's limited waiver of liability contained in Section 768.28, *Florida Statutes*, or any other statute or law.
- **SECTION 12. MISCELLANEOUS.** All proposals shall include the following information in addition to any other requirements of the proposal documents.
 - A. List the position or title of all personnel to perform work on the District audit. Include resumes for each person listed; list years of experience in present position for each party listed and years of related experience.
 - B. Describe proposed staffing levels, including resumes with applicable certifications.
 - C. Three references from projects of similar size and scope. The Proposer should include information relating to the work it conducted for each reference as well as a name, address and phone number of a contact person.
 - D. The lump sum cost of the provision of the services under the proposal for the District's first audit for which there are no special assessment bonds, plus the lump sum cost of two (2) annual renewals, which renewals shall include services related to the District's anticipated issuance of special assessment bonds.
- **SECTION 13. PROTESTS.** In accordance with the District's Rules of Procedure, any protest regarding the Proposal Documents, must be filed in writing, at the offices of the

Points will be awarded based upon the lowest total proposal for rendering the services and the reasonableness of the proposal.

b. SPECIFIC AUDIT APPROACH

Our partners are not strangers who show up for an entrance conference and an exit conference. We have developed an audit plan that allows the partners to directly supervise our staff in the field. By assigning two partners to the audit, we will have a partner on-site for a significant portion of the fieldwork. This also gives the District an additional contact individual for questions or problems that may arise during the audit.

The scope of our services will include a financial, as well as, a compliance audit of the District's financial statements. Our audit will be conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Additionally, our audit will be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 10.550, Rules of the Auditor General, which govern the conduct of local government entity audits performed in the State of Florida.

Our audit approach places emphasis on the accounting information system and how the data is recorded, rather than solely on the verification of numbers on a financial statement. This approach enables us to:

- Maximize our understanding of the District's operating environment
- ➤ Minimize time required conducting the audit since we start with broad considerations and narrow to specific audit objectives in critical areas

Our audit approach consists of four phases encompassing our audit process:

- ➤ Planning Phase
- ➤ Detailed Audit Phase
- **➤**Closing Phase
- **≻**Reporting

Planning Phase

Meetings and Expectations:

Our first step in this phase will be to set up a planning meeting with the financial and operating management of Koa Bay Community Development District. Our goal here is to eliminate "surprises." By meeting with responsible officials early on we can discuss significant accounting policies, closing procedures and timetables, planned timing of our audit procedures and expectations of our work. This will also be the starting point for our discussions with management related to SAS No. 99-Consideration of Fraud in a Financial Statement Audit. Inquiries will be made regarding managements knowledge of fraud and on management's views regarding the risk of fraud.

Review Operations and Develop Engagement Plan

It is critical that we understand the District's operating environment. To do this we will obtain and review such items as, organizational charts, recent financial statements, budget information, major contracts and lease agreements. We will also gather other information necessary to increase our understanding of the District's operations, organization, and internal control.

Study and Evaluate Internal Control

As part of general planning, we will obtain an understanding and assessment of the District's control environment. This assessment involves a review of management's operating style, written internal control procedures, and the District's accounting system. The assessment is necessary to determine if we can rely on control procedures and thus reduce the extent of substantive testing.

We then test compliance with established control procedures by ascertaining that the significant strengths within the system are functioning as described to us. Generally, transactions are selected and reviewed in sufficient detail to permit us to formulate conclusions regarding compliance with control procedures and the extent of operation compliance with pertinent laws and regulations. This involves gaining an understanding of the District's procedures, laws and regulations, and testing systems for compliance by examining contracts, invoices, bid procedures, and other documents. After testing controls, we then evaluate the results of those tests and decide whether we can rely on controls and thus reduce other audit procedures.

Conduct Preliminary Analytical Review

Also during the planning stage, we undertake analytical procedures that aid us in focusing our energies in the right direction. We call these analytical reviews.

A properly designed analytical review can be a very effective audit procedure in audits of governmental units. Analytical reviews consist of more than just a comparison of current-year actual results to prior-year actual results. Very effective analytical review techniques include trend analysis covering a number of years and comparisons of information not maintained totally within the financial accounting system, such as per capita information, prevailing market interest rates, housing statistics, etc.

Some examples of effective analytical reviews performed together and/or individually include:

- ➤ Comparison of current-year actual results with current-year budget for the current and past years with investigation of significant differences and/or trends
- > Trend analysis of the percentage of current-year revenues to current-year rates for the current and previous years with investigation of significant changes in the collection percentage
- > Trend analysis of the percentage of expenditures by function for the current and previous years with investigation of significant changes in percentages by department
- Monthly analysis of receipts compared to prior years to detect trends that may have audit implications

Conclusions reached enable us to determine the nature, timing and extent of other substantive procedures.

Detailed Audit Phase

Conduct Final Risk Assessment and Prepare Audit Programs

Risk assessment requires evaluating the likelihood of errors occurring that could have a material affect on the financial statements being audited. The conclusions we reach are based on many evaluations of internal control, systems, accounts, and transactions that occur throughout the audit. After evaluating the results of our tests of control and our final risk assessment we can develop detailed audit programs.

Perform Substantive Tests of Account Balances

These tests are designed to provide reasonable assurance as to the validity of the information produced by the accounting system. Substantive tests involve such things as examining invoices supporting payments, confirmation of balances with independent parties, analytical review procedures, and physical inspection of assets. All significant accounts will be subjected to substantive procedures. Substantive tests provide direct evidence of the completeness, accuracy, and validity of data.

Perform Single Audit Procedures (if applicable)

During the planning phase of the audit we will request and review schedules of expenditures of federal awards and state financial assistance. These schedules will be the basis for our determination of the specific programs we will test.

In documenting our understanding of the internal control system for the financial statement audit, we will identify control activities that impact major federal and state programs as well. This will allow us to test certain controls for the financial audit and the single audit concurrently. We will then perform additional tests of controls for each federal and state program selected for testing. We will then evaluate the results of the test of controls to determine the nature, timing and extent of substantive testing necessary to determine compliance with major program requirements.

Perform Statutory Compliance Testing

We have developed audit programs for Koa Bay Community Development District designed to test Florida Statutes as required by the Auditor General. These programs include test procedures such as general inquiries, confirmation from third parties, and examination of specific documents.

Closing Phase

During the closing phase we perform detail work paper reviews, request legal letters, review subsequent events and proposed audit adjustments. Communication with the client is critical in this phase to ensure that the information necessary to prepare financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States has been obtained.

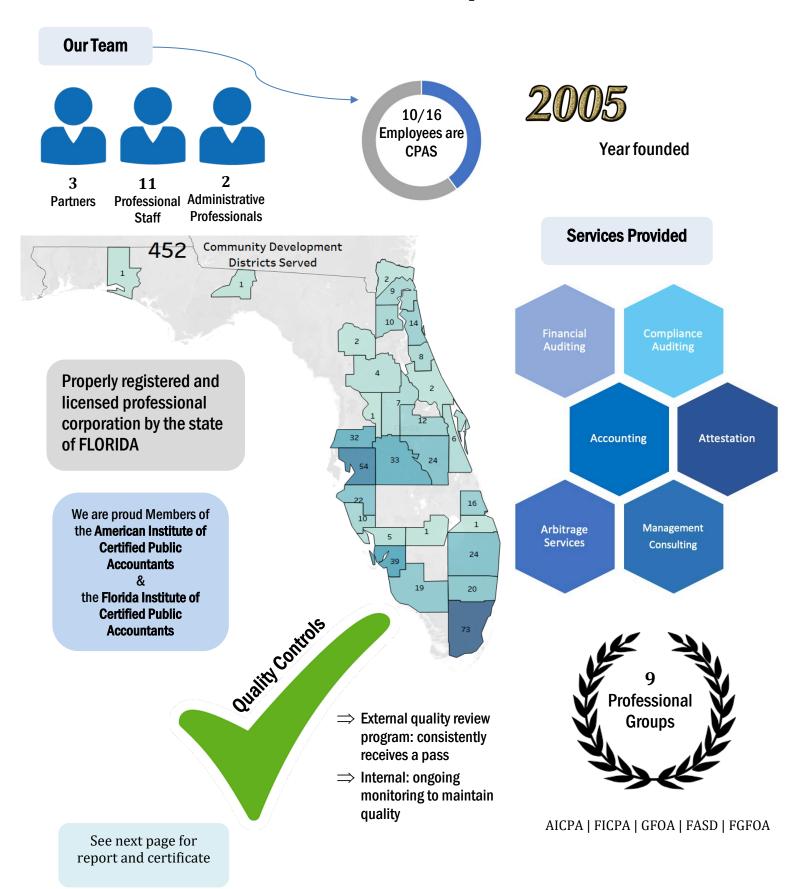

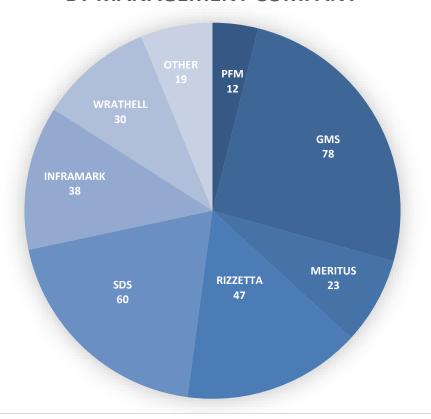

Specific Audit Approach



AUDIT APPROACH

Grau's Understanding of Work Product / Scope of Services:





ITID is a State of Florida 298 District. CAPTEC performed a traffic calming study within the M-1 and M-2 Drainage Basin and reviewed conceptual traffic calming measures at intersection locations within the district boundaries. There are 71 intersections in this area. Reviewed traffic accident data available on these intersections, performed a visual field review and obtained photo documentation of the existing conditions. Based on the findings, a traffic calming plan and report with conceptual traffic calming and safety improvements in the vicinity of these intersections were prepared. CAPTEC utilized the Traffic Counters/Velocity equipment to measure traffic volume and vehicle speed on roadways and to monitor traffic calming improvements for effectiveness. These improvements included mid-block island/ speed tables, roundabouts and raised median approaches at intersections with pavement marking enhancement. Attended public meetings to obtain feedback for the development of the final traffic calming plan. Currently working with ITID and Palm Beach County to obtain FDOT/ Federal Grants to pay for these improvements unique to rural communities. CAPTEC is designing R3 Roadway Plans for 37,981 feet (12 roadways) that will convert unpaved roads to paved roadways for a total of 7-miles. The roadway designs include two (2) 11-foot lanes and rural swale for drainage, 5-foot sidewalk on one side were existing and driveway adjustments. CAPTEC is also providing CEI services for the removal of existing speed bumps and layout of new speed bump locations, milling and paving, striping and sign installations. These services include scheduling, conducting and providing minutes of the Pre-Construction Conference, shop drawings review and approval, MOT review and recommendations, and daily setup/ removal, reviewing and providing recommendations for monthly pay applications, change orders, time extensions, conducting progress meetings, providing minutes of meetings, providing daily reports and photographs to document progress, review and approve final construction as-built drawings completed and provided by the construction Contractor. CAPTEC will ensure all constructed sidewalks meet ADA guidelines, will review and monitor the Contractor's erosion control plan, and provide final Certification of the project upon completion of the work. CAPTEC provides District Engineering support on Stormwater Management items which entailed the updating of the GIS LIDAR Data by FEMA to remap this rural area of Palm Beach County. This remapping, with the assistance of Sub-Consultant Team Member NorthStar Geomatics, Inc. removed substantial homesites from the FEMA Area Zone A, Flood Zones, potentially removing the need for flood insurance for

a substantial number of residents. CAPTEC also reviews all transportation items for the District relative to slope protection along canals, pipe size improvements, roadway designs, infrastructure improvements and stormwater treatment lakes planned for the various major arterial roadways and provides CEI Services. CAPTEC prepared 100% design plans for this roadway to include drainage (including lakes), utility plans, irrigation and landscape design, and lake siting for roadway fill material. The drainage design was consistent with the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) Conceptual Permit for Southern Grove. The drainage plan included an equalizer pipe between lakes L22B and L24A. Utility design included water mains, gravity sewer mains, a lift station, water, and sewer services to future parcel(s) and force mains as needed. It is anticipated that the parcels located to the north of the proposed East/ West Road #2 will be served by the existing lift station at the intersection of Tom Mackie Blvd. and Trade Center Dr. A lift station was designed for the properties abutting the proposed portion of roadway south of E/W Road #2.

A service area analysis for the lift station was done to potentially include future land south of Marshall Parkway. Additionally, coordination with Florida Power and Light (FPL) was needed for the design of power conduits to be included on the plans. The proposed Lift Station required 460 Volt, 3 phase power. Tom Mackie Blvd extension and E/W Road #2 will be located within a proposed 100-foot right-of-way. Marshall Parkway will be located within the existing 150-foot right-of-way.

Tom Mackie Blvd. and E/W Road #2 have been designed with 10-foot public utility easements located outside of the right-of-way (ROW) on both sides, 12-foot travel lanes, 6-foot paved shoulders, 8-foot-wide sidewalk on both sides of the ROW, street trees, main trunk-line drainage, and swale drainage. Marshall Parkway is designed as a 4-lane median divided with 10-foot public utility easements located outside of the ROW on both sides, 12-foot travel lanes, 4-foot paved shoulders, 10-foot sidewalk on both sides of the ROW, street trees, and curb and gutter drainage. CAPTEC developed a "City of Port St. Lucie Stormwater Master Plan" that was consistent with the adopted goals, objectives and programs of the City Council and Public Works Department. The Stormwater Master Plan (SWMP) provided a general overview of the City's Stormwater Systems and an outline of its needs. The submittal included comprehensive summary of previous stormwater modeling and results, a narrative and a map of the various basins. The SWMP analyzed the existing stormwater system, the historic modeling performed, and outlined the major basins and sub-basins. The project area included the entire City of Port St. Lucie and outlying areas that affect the City's stormwater system.

The goals of this SWMP are to:

- reduce flood damage, including damage to life and property;
- minimize, to the extent practical, any increase in stormwater runoff from any new development;
- reduce soil erosion from any development or construction project;
- assure the adequacy of existing and proposed culverts and bridges, and other in-stream structures;
- maintain groundwater recharge;


- prevent, to the greatest extent feasible, an increase in nonpoint pollution;
- maintain the integrity of stream channels for their biological functions, as well as for drainage;
- minimize pollutants in stormwater runoff from new and existing developments to restore, enhance, and maintain the chemical, physical, and biological integrity of the waters of the state, to protect public health, to safeguard fish and aquatic life and scenic and ecological values, and to enhance the domestic, municipal, recreational, industrial, and other uses of water;
- protect public safety through the proper design and operation of stormwater basins.

The overall SWMP incorporated various system components including: The City of Port St. Lucie Major Basin Areas (North Port St. Lucie/ Sharret, Eastern Watershed, Midport, Cameo and Monterrey and C-24 Basins, Watersheds A-B-C, and D, Central Watershed, Veterans Memorial Watershed), and historic inflows into and through the City Limits from the North Fork St. Lucie River, SFWMD C-23 and C-24 Canals, St. Lucie County and the northern area in the water control districts (North St. Lucie River Water Control District, Tradition CDD, Southern Grove CDD, St. Lucie West Services District, Ft. Pierce Farms Water Control District).

"Water Quality" issues were also addressed relative to possible changes to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) Basin Management Action Plan (BMAP) relative to nitrogen, phosphorous, total suspended solids, heavy metals and fecal coliform. Recommendations will be provided for reducing pollutants and contaminants. Other best management practices were addressed included: water farming, septic tank elimination, National Point Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), maintenance (canals, lakes, stormwater treatment areas), wetlands, pump stations, stabilization, actuators, swale liners, litter, waste control, data collection for improvements, maintenance activities, and monitoring of permanent and temporary systems, salt water intrusion and hazardous materials.


